

**TOWN OF MARSHALL  
BYLAW NO 10-2013**

**A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE NUMBERING OF HOUSES AND OTHER BUILDINGS**

The Council of the Town of Marshall in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw shall be referred to as the Civic Addressing Bylaw.
  2. A uniform system of numbering houses and other buildings is hereby established and is posted at the municipal office.
  3. A separate number shall be assigned for each 50 feet of frontage or other frontage as specified by Town records.
  4. Each house or building shall bear the number assigned to the frontage on which the front entrance is situated.
  5. Notwithstanding section 4 of this bylaw, upon request of the owner of a property situated on a corner, the number assigned may be specific to the flankage.
  6. In case a house or building is occupied by more than one family dwelling unit or business, each separate front entrance of said house or building shall bear The same number extended with a letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter "A" and proceeding with as many as are required.
  7. Numerals indicating the official number of each house or building or each front entrance shall be posted in a manner as to be visible from the street on which the property is located.
  8. In the event, the required numbers are not affixed on a house or building, a town official shall remedy the non conformance by affixing the appropriate numbers to the front of the dwelling or building, thereby identifying the address of the property.
  9. The Chief Administrative Officer shall be responsible for maintaining the numbering system and shall keep a record of all numbers assigned under this bylaw.
  10. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of:
    - (a) \$100.00 per offence and;
    - (b) all costs incurred by a Town Official to remedy the non conformance;
11. A violator as set out in section 10, may, during regular office hours, voluntarily pay the penalty and costs at the municipal office. Violators who comply within seven (7) days of receiving a notice of violation and invoice for costs shall have the \$100 penalty waived.
